

- Its objectives:


Advance the circular economy concept in Member States, regional and local governments, civil society and businesses and also link to the global dimension

Finland

An <u>Event Trailer</u> packed with goods and tools needed in the organisation of different events (audio equipment, a tent, a grill and a gas cooker, traffic control and first-aid equipment and cam carts).



France

<u>RecycLivre.com</u> is a website selling second-hand books which aims to establish a relationship based on solidarity between its customers and underprivileged groups.



Belgium

<u>PuriFungi</u>'s mushroom eats festivalgoers' cigarette butts. It turns the butts into a resin within 2 weeks. This resin is then usable for bricks, plastic goods and leather ware.
